

What to do when NOT detecting??

Attribution of Roman Coins:

Continuing on from our last installment of the "What to do when Not detecting" I wanted to give a quick introduction to the attribution "attributing" of ancient roman coins.

Attribution is: the process of identifying a coin and describing it. It can help you identify the ruler who issued the coin, the type of coin, the denomination, and possibly the time and place it was minted

Attribution is not an easy process per se and would be nearly impossible for the average person without reference the internet or countless books on the subject, but it is not impossible if you look at **6 key characteristics**:

- 1.) Physical Characteristics
- 2.) Obverse Legend (wording on front)
- 3.) Obverse Device (picture on front)
- 4.) Reverse Legend (wording on back)
- 5.) Reverse Device (picture on back)
- 6.) Mint Mark and/or other markings other markings



1.) Physical Characteristics:

Physical measurements weight as well as diameter can be used to reference each coin from many source online Die alignment or rotation can also help determine the type, age and mint of a coin as many were specific to a those attributes. These were hammered coins and so the alignment could vary a lot, flipping a coin on its vertical access with the front and back images face the same orientation is called "medal", if they are 180 degrees rotated it is called "coin". Knowing a coins metal material (bronze, copper, silver, gold) can also aid in attributing a coin.

2.) 3.) 4.) and 5.) 6.) Wording, pictures, mint marks:

Since ancient roman coins were minted from the 3rd century BC to the 5th century AD and the empire and its territories spanned most of present day Southern Europe, Northern Africa, the UK and a good part of the middle east, the types of coins, denomination, mints (and associate mint marks) and above all wording and imagery is endless. Also the wording is familiar "roman" alphabet but written in Latin. Once more, they often abbreviated words to fit them on the coin. The Devices or "motifs" PICTURES, front and back will also take many resources to match up imagery but there are several sites below that can show you these. Locate one item at a time, and be patient, it will take a bit to get used to the different wording and picture conventions but eventually these also become familiar, good luck! :) I can go into deeper depth on this in the future if enough people are interested :)
